Dec. 1976: graduation from high school (Abitur)
Feb. 1977: awarded with a prize as one of the winners of the "Bundeswettbewerb Mathematik 1976", a German competition in mathematics
1977 – 1981: study of mathematics (main subject) and theoretical physics (secondary subject) at the University of Frankfurt am Main, Germany
July 1981: diploma (equivalent to a master's degree) in mathematics
1983 – 1987: scientific assistant and PhD student of mathematics in Frankfurt
Nov. 1987: PhD in mathematics at the University of Frankfurt (advisor and first referee of the thesis: Prof Dr. H. Behr; second referee: Prof. Dr. R. Bieri)
June 1988: the University of Frankfurt awards prizes to the physicist J. Ullrich and me for the best 1987 dissertations in natural sciences
since 1987: teaching and research in mathematics on various positions (see employment history below); within that time
July 1995: Habilitation in mathematics at the University of Frankfurt
Dec. 1996: an extended version of the habilitation thesis is published as Springer Lecture Notes in Mathematics, volume no. 1641

- Jan. 1983 – Dec. 1987: scientific assistant at the Department of Mathematics at the University of Frankfurt
- Jan. 1988 – Aug. 1989: temporary position as scientific employee at the same department in Frankfurt
- Sep. 1989 – Dec. 1990: research position at the "Sonderforschungsbereich 343" in mathematics at the University of Bielefeld, Germany
- Jan. 1991 – Mar. 1991: temporary position as scientific employee at the University of Frankfurt
- Apr. 1991 – Apr. 1997: C1-position (comparable to an assistant professorship) at the Department of Mathematics at the University of Frankfurt
- June 1997 – May 1998: research position at the "Sonderforschungsbereich 343" in mathematics at the University of Bielefeld
- June 1998 – Aug. 2001: Heisenberg fellow (distinguished research fellowship in Germany); paid by the German DFG for doing research work wherever I was welcome as (scientific) guest and provided with due working conditions. Normally I was working at the Department of Mathematics at the University of Bielefeld
- Jan. – May 2000: Visiting Scholar (still paid by the DFG) at the Department of Mathematics at Cornell University in Ithaca, NY
- Since Aug. 2001: Associate Professor of Mathematics at the Department of Mathematics at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville
